Current research: Working papers and Work-in-Progress

An enduring area of research is "**employee participation and human resource management practices**". A key strategy in this research is the use of "**insider econometrics or econometric case studies**". In addition large establishment and firm-level data sets continue to be assembled. In one country matching data for individual employees is also being gathered. Current projects are underway in several countries including the U.S., Finland, China, the Baltic Republics and the Balkans. Key areas of investigation include high performance workplace practices including employee involvement mechanisms such as teams and ways of facilitating financial participation such as employee ownership and broad based stock options. Another focus is on employment practices in firms that mainly employ workers with low levels of formal education. I also continue to work on diverse issues for producer cooperatives.

A second research area examines diverse issues for **transition economies**. Panel data sets have been assembled for large samples of firms in Bulgaria, Latvia, Estonia, Lithuania and Russia. I draw on these data to examine several research issues and already have produced several country (region) specific papers on particular issues as well as some cross national studies, often collaboratively. In addition, a large city-level data set has been assembled for China. For all of these projects, data collection and writing and analyses are on-going processes.

Also I have a large interest in the **new economy and internet economics** . Activities in this area include: acting as senior editor for the **Handbook of Economics in the Electronic Age**, (Elsevier, 2003), undertaking a survey of firms in NY that emphasizes IT issues, and investigation of price determination in on-line auctions..
